After several meetings, a group of 26 people collected £280.00 between them, and after registration, East Kilbride Credit Union was born. From a group of residents with a dream, collecting money in old margarine tubs, to a full staff and Board of Directors in our official premises at 43 Brouster Hill, EKCU has come a long way in 40 years! East Kilbride Credit Union has had a few different homes over the years. We started at the Greenhills Community Centre and the St. Vincent's huts at the school; some of our older members may remember this. We then resided in the Red Deer Centre for a while, until we moved on to our offices in the village, with a small office also running in the Greenhills Square. We finally settled down in our current building at the top of Brouster Hill, which used to belong to the Children's Panel the old telephone and exchange.

We had to keep up with the times and compete with other lenders, so inevitably we had to evolve and bring the credit union into the 21st century. Long gone are the days of keeping money in a margarine tub under a desk and hand written pay in books. With the help of technology, we produced a streamline digital system combined with a personal face to face service. We created a way for all of our members to use our services even from the comfort of their own home.


Over twenty one thousand members have made use of our services through the years. Four of our first ten original members still actively use their account to this day!

It was early in 1980 when 6 of us sat down and discussed credit unions;. Sally and Ronnie McEwan, Peter and Jenny Jones, Shirley and myself after several meetings. I was getting fed up, nothing but talks, so I decided we had to call ABCUL chairman Bill Murphy. I knew Bill from another organisation, and we went from there. Our first collection was 2 years later, 26 of us put our hands in our pockets and collectively we had £280. I think we paid out £260 for registration, but I do remember we were in profit by £20. As far as I know am the only original member of that steering committee still alive now at age 80, I personally visited every church in East Kilbride to pass on the news of this wonderful idea.

My Mum was very involved in the Credit Union when it opened at first in The Village, her name was Janet Robinson. My mum made many friends, Mary McCann being one of them, Jimmy Fitzpatrick and I'm sure his wife was involved too, my memory is failing me for the rest of the friends. THE HISTORY OF DAVA HOUSE

We recently completed a small report on some old title deeds we had been gifted when purchasing 43 Brouster Hill or Dava House. These deeds are quite amazing to see in person and go all the way back to 1912 when the property was built by a Mr Peter MacKellar (Jeweller).

We decided to contact the East Kilbride History Group and Chris kindly came out to visit us, looked at the deeds and provided us with so much more history than we could have imagined. Chris confirmed that Dava House, initially called Rhoda, was positioned on 47 Auldhouse Road, later becoming 43 Brouster Hill. The house was built on the old site of the original Righead Farm and known to locals as the 'big house' and considered one of the best built in the area.

The site was purchased from the Torrance estate and any build would have been required to follow building conditions, as the Torrance estate strived to ensure a degree of neatness and harmony with the other buildings in the area. Our building is made from blonde sandstone, which was more than likely brought in on the local railway rather than taken from local deposits and each room was built with high ceilings, most likely due to the use of open fires and paraffin lamps.



Dava house was only sold on 5 times in its history as a residential property before being acquired by the East Kilbride Development Corporation in 1956. The sale prices have fluctuated over the years, but unbelievable at one point, the building was sold for £1800.00 in 1932 which is less than our average loan in 2022.

The building has been owned by a jeweller, a professor of mining at Glasgow University, and a Mining Engineer. It has been leased to a District Surveyor, the Post Office Telephone Exchange, the Lanarkshire Health Board (The Baby Clinic) and Strathclyde Regional Council (Children's Panel).









We would like to extend a special thanks to Chris Ladds, for his help in creating a history of our building and for a very detailed 38 page report, which has been very enjoyable to read.

The Archive represents the largest collection of historical records pertaining to East Kilbride and the district within its traditional Parish Boundary. They aim to source, obtain, preserve, interpret and make available all manner of records relating to this area for best public use. Saturday Opening


We are trialling Saturday morning opening for our members. We will be open to our members on the first Saturday of each month from 10:00 - 13:00.


